After an intentional Lent season of tending to the parched areas of our lives, cultivating practices that enliven our faith, and letting go of those things which keep us out of sync with God’s movement, the origami paper on which we wrote our concerns every Sunday are now bursting with life in the form of cranes on the chancel tree. On Easter death has been eradicated, the tomb is empty, and we are invited into the work of ushering in a new creation. God is doing a new thing, and it is blooming in front of us for all to see.

Anthem notes: Christ is Arisen was written by Kenneth Jennings in 2004. Jennings lived from 1925-2015 and is remembered for his time as the director of the St. Olaf Choir (from 1968-1990). He was a published arranger and composer, as well as choral music educator. The text for this piece comes from the collection *Symphonia Sirenum* which was published in Köln in 1695 and translated into English by Francis Pott.

A Hymn of Resurrection was written in 2009 by Gwyneth Walker (b. 1947). Walker is a full-time composer who resides both in New Canaan, Connecticut and Randolph, Vermont. Over the years she has written over 350 compositions for orchestra, chamber ensembles, chorus and solo voice. “A Hymn of Resurrection” was written for her childhood church, the Congregational Church of New Canaan, Connecticut. She was inspired by the aria, “I Know My Redeemer Liveth” from Handel’s *Messiah*. She also discovered a poem by Jessie B. Pounds (1861-1921) and adapted it to create this text. **Hallelujah** is the final movement of the second part of Handel’s *Messiah*. Apparently at the London premiere in 1743, King George II stood during “Hallelujah!” which made everyone else stand. Portions of the text come from Revelation 19:6 (for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth), Revelation 19:16 (*King of Kings and Lords of Lords*) and Revelation 11:15 (*And he shall reign for ever and ever*).

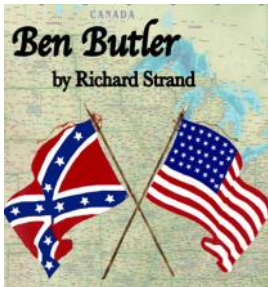


“Vision Eternal—Artistic Testimonies of Faith”:
