STEWARDSHIP 2018 - Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow

Stewardship Nugget:

In the past two years, FPC was able to send \$28,487 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for hurricane relief. We have packed 125,000 meals in the last 5 years to feed hungry families across the world. We purchase, receive, and send out approximately \$4000.00 of food a month to our local food banks to feed the hungry in Fort Wayne. We took Yein “Paul” Park under care as an Inquirer for Ministry. This is the first step in becoming a Minister of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church USA (PCUSA). He's currently a first year student at Louisville Presbyterian Seminary.

This year's stewardship theme is “**Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow**”. We have rich **yesterdays** in our history, yet here we are **today** with a vibrant congregation worshipping in a beautiful structure anxious to share our faith and mission with the community. What do we want **tomorrow** to look like? These are just some of the questions we'll reflect on in this year's campaign. **Pledge Dedication Sunday is November 18!** Be on the lookout for details and letters in your mail this week.

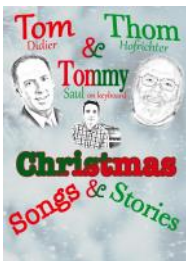
