


This week my "Thoughts and Prayers" sermon series continues with a look at Prayer as Singing, Art, and Dancing. This will be a fun one!

Faces of First- Beth Iserman



Beth and her family (husband Tony Borton and daughter Matilda) began attending First Pres in 2019. They decided to join in late Spring 2020, amid the pandemic and George Floyd protests. During a time of so much uncertainty, Beth found what she and her family were looking for in a church: "There are many aspects of the experience at FPC that I love, so it's hard

to list them all. Some highlights include all the lovely people we've been lucky enough to develop friendships with, exposing our daughter to highly competent, compassionate and awesome female leadership, aligning our political beliefs with a church that urges us to take action (I didn't think this was possible), myriad opportunities to tie current events to scripture (bible study, sermons, lecture series, etc.) and so many ways to serve others. I'm proud to be a member of FPC, which is not an experience I have had before."

Beth was quick to get involved in the FPC community and has continued to expand her involvement in the church. FPC's long tradition of supporting social justice issues and helping the needy was a particular draw: "I have the honor of being a member of the Missions Committee, focusing on Mission Co-Workers and Social Justice, and we like to attend FPC events like Project 216 (packing meals for the needy). I'm a new member of the Fine Arts Committee and help with MAD2 Camp (children's art camp) in the summer. I like that there are so many opportunities to become involved."

The four years Beth has spent in the FPC community have given her many favorite experiences and memories. Her family's involvement in the CYF Ministry is a particular highlight: "I have many favorite memories, one of which is ice skating at the Headwaters Park rink with my husband, daughter and the rest of the Children, Youth, and Family members. Like many times before this, FPC acted as a catalyst. We hadn't visited the Headwaters Park rink before, I had not skated for decades and we may never have done this if we hadn't had this opportunity, facilitated by FPC. It was a lot of fun, a lot of falling down and a lot of camaraderie with other church members. It reminded me of parts of myself that I had forgotten and how lucky we are to be at FPC."

Beth's warmth and kindness, her commitment to FPC, and her

passion for social justice and missions is deeply appreciated. Thank you, Beth, for being an integral part of our faith community.




