Music Director's Note



Dear Friends,

As Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey with everyone throwing down their robes and shouting "Hosanna", the chant, "Crucify" was soon on their lips. On Sunday, you will have the opportunity to gather in the courtyard (or McKay Hall depending on the weather) to hear the account of the Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. And there will be palm

branches to wave as we enter the Sanctuary singing *All Glory Laud and Honor*. As we celebrate Palm/Passion Sunday with liturgy, the waving of palms, and majestic hymns, we will hear the importance of this day as it begins this holiest of weeks.

Then on Thursday, we celebrate the last supper in the Chapel with communion, readings, handwashing, and hymns to help us understand the anguish and suffering of the cross. And on Good Friday, we will gather for a moving service of readings, a little music, and austere silence as we contemplate the death of our Lord Jesus Christ and what it means for our lives both now and forever.

While God loved us so much to go through the agonies of the cross, the even bigger miracle is the resurrection three days later. A miracle that only God can do! After contemplating the entirety of Holy Week both together at the services and at home by ourselves, we will gather on Easter Sunday to celebrate our Risen Lord. This festival service will have glorious music provided by brass, choirs, organ, readings, and messages of our hope in the resurrection.

As we anticipate the arrival of Holy Week, please do read the accounts of the Triumphal Entry, the Last Supper, Jesus' Death, and Resurrection as your heart's preparation. And please come to the services to celebrate the most meaningful of weeks together. While I dearly love celebrating Christmas, Holy Week is my favorite because it commemorates how we can know God and, as the hymn *There Is a Green Hill Far Away* says, "He died to make us good." The hope, the joy, and the comfort this gives makes life worth living as we serve our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

May we have a meaningful Holy Week together propelling us to serve God and to show true love to all we meet.
