Earth Day 2024



Plant a Tree for the Planet: The Green Team and Trees Indiana are providing saplings to members after the 11:00 service in the Narthex on Sunday, April 21st. These will be easy to handle, bare-root Butternut and Black Walnut so no big holes are required for planting! Please plan to get them in the ground soon

after receiving so their roots don't dry out. Here are some details:

Butternut trees are found across Indiana. Lately, they have been stricken with a fungal disease reducing their numbers, so they are in need of our help to reestablish. Butternuts grow 40 to 60 feet with compound leaves that are green in the summer and yellow in the fall. The nuts are edible and similar to Walnuts making them nice habitat and shade trees. They do well in moist/well drained, loamy soils but can tolerate drier, rocky soils. Black Walnuts are some of the tallest trees in Indiana's forests. They are desired for their delicious nuts and for wood products such as high-quality furniture, architectural millwork, flooring, and other specialty products. Black walnuts grow 50 to 75 feet tall, prefer sunshine and well-drained soil. They tolerate poor soils, but growth will be slow and wood quality poor. Be mindful of your planting site for Black Walnut roots send a chemical to neighboring plants that can prohibit their neighbors' growth.
