

South Side HS Initiative: The Missions Committee would like to invite members of First Pres to learn more about opportunities to support our neighbors--both students and staff--at South Side HS through volunteer opportunities with the Peacemakers. Learn more about how students in the Peace Club

and the summer Peacemaker Academy are promoting an atmosphere of non-violence, respect and love for one another, and how you can help.

Dates in November for upcoming informational and training sessions for new volunteers will be available soon, and there is also an ongoing adult discussion group that meets every 2 weeks to discuss principles of Kingian non-violence adapted from the teachings of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In the meantime, the next South Side lunch with "Grammies & Grampies" is scheduled for Wednesday October 30th, and there are still a couple openings if anyone is ready to jump in. We'll be visiting

the cafeteria at lunch to hand out candy and take a moment to say hi and chat. Animal Supply Collection: As colder months approach, the Green Team is planning to collect, from the congregation, supplies needed by Fort Wayne Animal Care and Control. On November 17 we will be collecting canned dog food, canned cat food - pate, used towels, used flat sheets, small blankets, cardboard toilet paper rolls, cardboard paper towel rolls, egg cartons, tissue boxes-empty, and plastic grocery bags.



Fort Wayne Animal Care and Control is the largest open-access shelter in northeast Indiana and serves all of Allen County, seeing 10,000 animals annually. Open-access means no animal is turned away which means community support is needed. The Center also has many programs which serves communities and families in need with pet support and help. Please save and gather some of these supplies so our church community can help support these animal friends in need.
