Pastor's Note



Dear First Pres Friends,

Some of you have reached out to me this week expressing your thoughts about the presidential election results, asking if I'll have something to offer on Sunday. The answer is yes because, as I said in my sermon on September 29, "politics doesn't stand apart from our deeply held values. And our religion

has something to say about what we should value." In many ways, my sermon on Sunday is the unplanned final sermon in my "Who Is My Neighbor?" sermon series.

The decision to install the new Sanctuary sound system this week and hold worship in McKay Hall the Sunday after the

election was an intentional one. I think it is important for us to come together as *a community*, worshipping around tables where we have an opportunity to talk and sit side by side. Our worship will also be structured slightly differently, with less singing but more reflection, and it will be more informal than we're used to. So, when you come into McKay Hall for worship, feel free to grab a cup of coffee and a cookie. A harpist is providing music, so I encourage you to come earlier, too.

I hope to see you Sunday in person.

Grace & Gratitude





On November 17 we will be collecting canned dog food, canned cat food - pate, used towels, used flat sheets, small blankets, cardboard toilet

Fort Wayne Animal Care and Control is the largest open-access shelter in northeast Indiana and serves all of Allen County, seeing 10,000 animals annually.
