FPC Day School

The FPC Day School saw a year of growth and achievement in 2024. At the end of 2024, 65 children were enrolled representing 57 families, an increase from 54 children representing 50 families in 2023.

For the first time ever, the Day School was nominated in the "Best Childcare" category in the annual Fort Wayne Reader's Choice Awards, and placed placed third overall in the voting.

Supporting and including the families of our students through special events, parents nights out after hours care, and our Day School Chaplain ministry are vital components of our Day School outreach.

We are Christ's hands and feet in the world and we believe that we are called to meet the needs of the world around us. We do that through:

Project 216 Meal Packing event:

- FPC provided the food and the labor to pack meals to be shipped for distribution in areas impacted by Hurricanes Helene and Milton:
- 125 volunteers
- 25,000 meals packed
- 250,000 served (6 served per meal)

Hands On Fort Wayne

FPC's first ever Hands On Fort Wayne was held in 2024. The Sunday after Easter, FPC volunteers went out into the local community together and shared the good news of Christ through our actions—serving hands-on in a variety of settings with many of our community partners. Over 120 participants worked on eleven different projects, including:

- Wellspring on Broadway Outdoor Spring clean-up and landscaping
- St. Joseph's Women's Shelter on Lake Ave. – Interior Spring cleaning and landscaping
- The Towne House Retirement Community– Visiting residents to share food & fellowship
- Moody Park in West Central Outdoor Spring clean-up and landscaping

MAD2 Camp

FPC's annual MAD2 Camp summer arts program for children in grades K-5 welcomed nearly 100 campers! Music, Art, Drama and Dance (MAD2) classes were taught by instructors from our local arts partners, including Fort Wayne Dance Collective and Fort Wayne Youtheatre. At the conclusion of camp on Friday, the students performed in the annual MAD2 Camp Showcase, highlighting the artistic skills learned throughout the week in the program.

MAD2 Camp is inclusive to all children, and provides scholarships to those unable to attend without financial assistance. In addition, the investment of time and talent by many FPC volunteers impacts each child enrolled.







Fine Arts

Faith Enriched by Art...

The rich tradition of the arts at FPC continued in 2024. Our congregation and the Fort Wayne community enjoyed:

FPC also held the 62nd round of the National Organ Playing Competition, the oldest organ competition in the United States. Seventeen outstanding young musicians applied to compete for three spots at this prestiguous event in April.

The panel shared their recent successes and exciting developments in their respective areas of the Fort Wayne arts community, as well as their future goals, needs, and suggestions for the arts ministries at First Pres.

The congregation's generosity in 2024 was truly inspiring. Our "Five for the Future" stewardship campaign, which invited members to increase their annual pledge by 5%, resulted in an incredible 17% increase over 2023 pledges. While some pledges decreased due to members moving, life changes, or passing away, our overall total still increased by \$80,000.
