Job Description

The Director of Music Ministries at First Presbyterian Church of Fort Wayne is a full-time position that plays a central role in shaping the worship life of the congregation. In addition, the Director will oversee the church's Music Series (including the biennial National Organ Playing Competition), support efforts to grow music opportunities for children and youth, and engage the broader Fort Wayne community through creative partnerships and outreach.

Relationship

The Director of Music Ministries is accountable to the Session through the Personnel Committee and reports to the Pastor/Head of Staff

Primary Responsibilities

- Serve as primary director for all choirs
- Play organ and piano for Sunday worship services, special liturgical events, and weddings/funerals as requested
- Develop and manage a comprehensive music ministry that includes children, youth, and intergenerational participation
- Collaborate with the Pastor and staff on weekly worship planning and special services
- Select, prepare, and lead music that aligns with the liturgical calendar and sermon/scripture themes
- Recruit, mentor, and equip volunteer musicians of all skill levels
- Supervise additional music staff (e.g., section leaders, accompanists)
- Support and strengthen connections between the music ministry and the church's broader arts programming

- Manage the Annual Music Series including the biennial National Organ Playing Competition
- Manage the music ministry budget, music library, music copyrights, and care of instruments
