



Security Alarm Alert: Help Us Avoid False Alarms!

Friends, we need your help. Recently, our building security alarm has been triggered more often than the church bell on Sunday morning — and not in a good way. When someone enters the building without staff present, it sets off the alarm, which triggers a call to the alarm company, then to staff, and sometimes even to the police. It's disruptive, stressful, and entirely preventable.

If you need to enter the church outside of office hours, or when staff won't be present, please make arrangements with the church office ahead of time. Also, if you've scheduled an early arrival, please don't arrive earlier than planned — even a few minutes early can trigger the alarm if staff haven't had a chance to disarm the system yet.
