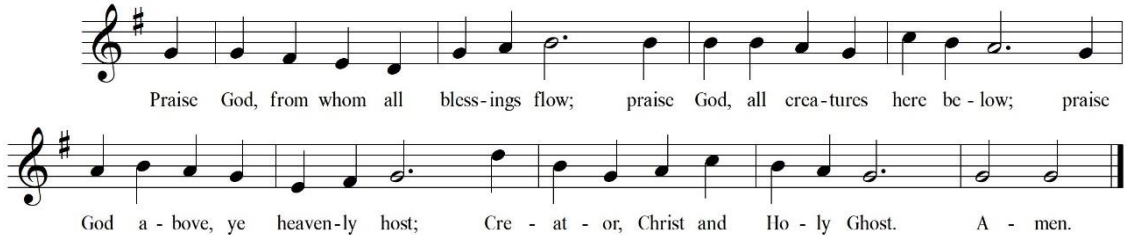

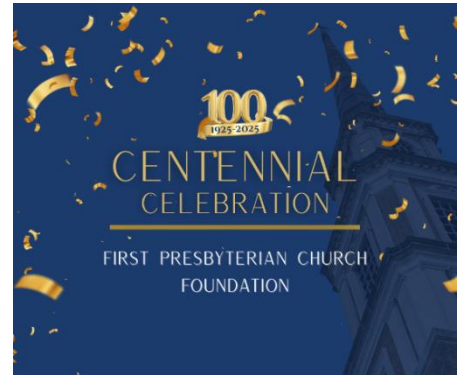
Three to four volunteers will cover each shift so there will be plenty of time to talk, laugh, hug, and make art together.
