Pastor's Letter



Dear First Presbyterian Friends,

It feels so good to be back! I've missed all your faces, your laughter, your faithfulness, and I can't wait to be back in worship with you this Sunday. Thank you for all the ways you cared for me while I was away. Your prayers, cards, meals, and

messages meant the world.

This week I'm kicking off a new sermon series on spiritual practices: simple, grounded ways we can stay centered and connected to God in the middle of all the craziness around us. And we're starting with one that feels especially timely: keeping Sabbath.

Let's be honest — life feels like a lot right now. The news is overwhelming, our calendars are full, and we wear "busy" like a badge of honor. But Sabbath invites us to do something totally countercultural: to *stop*, to rest, and to remember that we are more than our to-do lists.

Sabbath isn't just a day off; it's a way of saying, "The world will keep spinning even if I don't check my email." It's a reminder that God's in charge — and that rest is holy, too.

So this Sunday, we'll talk about what it means to keep Sabbath in a world that never seems to slow down, and how rest might just be the most faithful (and rebellious!) thing we can do.

See you Sunday — and maybe take a deep breath between now and then.


For the past 100 of the church's 194-year existence, the Foundation has served many

New Boiler Installation Complete: If you noticed cranes, dumpsters, and mysterious metal cylinders around the church this summer, here's the reason: a major upgrade to the church's heating system is now complete! The old single boiler has been replaced with a state-of-the-art twin boiler system.



The new system boosts efficiency, provides automatic backup, and protects the building from potential winter damage. Installed by Core Mechanical Services, with coordination assistance from Bill Patterson, the project was completed on time and ready for the season ahead.

As winter approaches, the congregation can look forward to a warm, comfortable space and a system built to last well into our third century of serving God here in Northeast Indiana.
