Dear Friends,

This Sunday we'll continue our series on *Spiritual Practices* with a focus on the practice of encountering others.

In her book *An Altar in the World*, Barbara Brown Taylor writes that the practice of encountering others is really the practice of recognizing the divine image in every person we meet. It's about seeing strangers not as interruptions, but as sacred opportunities for connection.

As I've reflected on my own journey of recovery, this practice has been deeply personal. I was reminded again and again that healing rarely happens alone, it happens through community. Through your prayers, cards, meals, and patience, I encountered the grace of God made visible in all of you.

It seems especially fitting, then, that this week we're also celebrating

the 100th anniversary of our church's Foundation—a ministry that has made possible so many encounters of grace across the decades. And as we dedicate our 2026 stewardship pledges, we're reminded that generosity, too, is a form of encounter: a way of extending ourselves to others in gratitude and hope.

So come this Sunday ready to celebrate our past, our present community, and the living God who meets us in one another.

New Director of Music Ministries Announced

Welcome Colin Andrews, Director of Music Ministries & Organist

We are delighted to announce that Colin Andrews will join First Presbyterian Church as Director of Music Ministries and Organist, beginning November 6, 2025.

An award-winning performer, educator, and church musician, Colin brings exceptional artistry and leadership to this role. Born in Bristol, England, he studied at London's Royal Academy of Music under Professors Douglas Hawkridge and Margaret MacDonald, in Geneva under Professor Lionel Rogg, and privately with the renowned Dame Gillian Weir. Colin's distinguished career has been recognized with numerous honors, including prizes at the 1980 and 1982 Dublin International Organ Competitions, and in 1993, an Associateship of the Royal Academy of Music in acknowledgment of his outstanding contributions to performance.

Colin has performed at leading halls and cathedrals across the United States, Europe, and Asia, inspiring audiences around the world. Most recently, in July 2025, he performed a concert at Westminster Abbey in London. A dedicated educator, he has served on the faculties of East Carolina University and Indiana University, and as a visiting professor at Florida State University. Most recently, Colin also served as Director of Music at First Presbyterian Church in Franklin, Indiana.

"I am delighted to have been called to be the new Director of Music Ministries and Organist at First Presbyterian Church in Fort Wayne," Colin states. "I have been impressed by the wealth of musical resources that are available at the church and the warmth of the welcome that I received during the interview process. I have known about First Presbyterian ever since I moved to the United States and so this is an amazing full-circle event for me. By happy coincidence, my wife and two teenage daughters are from South Korea, so to have a built-in Korean community is also a wonderful added bonus. I am excited to launch into my role as Director of Music and to becoming a part of the church family."


pastors, hear about the ministries of First Pres, and discover ways you can connect, serve, and grow. We'll even take a quick tour of the church so you can get to know our space and history.
