FWAIC-PFW Fall Food Drive: With the support of the Fort Wayne Area Interfaith Cooperative, we're joining other faith communities to help reduce food insecurity in our city.

On Sunday, November 9, PFW students will join us in worship to speak about the project and distribute paper bags with



lists of needed items. Please fill your bag and return it the following Sunday, November 16. Most donations will go toward feeding people in need, but we're also collecting food for animals cared for by Fort Wayne Animal Care and Control. The students will return to collect, weigh, and deliver all donations.

This effort reflects the shared values of the diverse faith communities within FWAIC, and we believe we are better together! From September through November, our community-wide food drive aims to fill 18 barrier-free Forward Indiana food pantries across Fort Wayne. Each pantry takes about 250 pounds to fill for one day. Together, we hope to collect 4,500 pounds of food to meet that goal.

Trans Day of Remembrance



Save the Date: Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance on November 20 that honors the memory of the transgender people whose lives were lost in acts of antitransgender violence. TDOR was started

in 1999 by transgender advocate Gwendolyn Ann Smith as a vigil to honor the memory of Rita Hester, a transgender woman who was killed in 1998.

In honor of those in our community and the world who have suffered violence or death, several local congregations and community organizations will join us for a special spoken-word and candle-lighting vigil held on November 20, at 6:30 PM in the McKay Hall Foyer. All are welcome.


